

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Day 10: Hazard (Mini Golf)

Each cell of the grid must be filled with a diagonal bumper, water hazard, or the hole. There is only one hole in the grid. Outside the grid, some clues are given based on where the ball ends up when putt into the grid: a flag if the ball reaches the hole, an X if it enters a water hazard, or a number if it exits the grid.
