## latinsquaresmash2

- Here are some more extremely mixed up $6 \times 6$ Latin Square puzzles. The objective is just like in a sudoku - fill each row and column and 6 square shape with each digit 1-6. Some of these puzzles have a 6 square set that isn't connected as a shape. There are no 'given' numbers, just obscure clues. Here's a list of what the clues mean:
circlearrow The digit in the circle is the sum of the other numbers on the arrow.

greaterthan
The < and > symbols symbolize digits greater or less than other digits.

evenodd
If a shape has shaded squares, they're even and the other squares in the shape are odd.

centernumber A number in the center of 4 squares represents the product (multiplication) of the 4 squares.

topcorner
The digit in the top corner of a small section, separated from the rest of the shape by a dashed line, is the sum of the digits in that section.
