Thrift Store griddle Story Logic

Four friends went out to some local thrift stores on a hunt for bargains. The receipts from the trip were a mess. Use the clues to determine who bought what item and the cast of the items.

Clue 1: Chantel spent exactly \$3 more than another member of the group.

Clue 2: Becky spent less than the person who bought the 3 size 10 brown left shoes.

Clue 3: Chantel didn't get the hat.

Clue 4: The big 60's hoop earrings cost at least \$3 less than Dave's item.

Clue 5: Nicole didn't purchase the pirate hat (which cost more than Becky's purchase).

Clue 6: Nicole either bought the earrings or spent \$5, but not both.

Clue 7: The dinosaur toys cost their purchaser either \$4 or \$5.

Clue 8: Dave did not purchase the shoes, and spent more than Nicole but less than Chantel.

The second thrift store trip yielded finds that were both awesome and were resold online for lots of profit. Use the clues to determine the purchases and profit earned.

Clue 9: The ugly purple sweater was purchased by either Becky or Dave.

Clue 10: The old mystery books yielded \$15 less profit than Chantel's item.

Clue 11: Nicole didn't get the books.

Clue 12: The rabbit and floral print plates were purchased and sold by someone besides Chantel.

Clue 13: The item that Dave bought yielded less profit than the gold plated touch lamp.


Clue 14: Becky's item either got \$15 or \$45 profit.

Clue 15: The sweater was purchased and sold by the person who spent \$5 in the first problem.

Clue 16: The lamp was either bought by the person who bought shoes in the first problem or was sold for a profit of \$15 but not both.

Can you solve both of the puzzles using the 16 clues given?
