

Instructions

Complete the kakuro grids using standard rules for kakuro: use the digits 1 through 9, no repeated digits in a section of row or column between dark lines, and the digits must total to the sums provided.

Additionally, placement of digits in the dash-outlined 'spinners' must be done with 180 degree rotational symmetry.
