
In each puzzle, split the grid into pentominoes (5-cell shapes) and fill each cell with a single letter.

Each row will contain two words, whose clues are provided in order from left to right, numbered by row.


Clues are also available for pentominoes, but are given in no particular order.

Those words are formed by reading left-to-right, with the top row first.

Example




In this example, the words SCALE, BRAVE, and SINGS form across the rows, and the pentominoes read SCABS, LEAVE, and RINGS.
